



Ten Ways Teachers and School Can Improve Parental Involvement

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1. Connect with parents on a consistent basis and let them know how they can contact you (phone, email, etc.).
2. Help parents feel connected by asking them to participate with the class.
3. Invite parents to volunteer for class trips and classroom activities and events.
4. Involve parents in developing school policies and strategies.
5. Keep parents informed of what their kids are learning and how they can support this at home.
6. Identify and address barriers to parent participation in school events and activities.
7. Sponsor fun family activities.
8. Collaborate with community organizations that serve the families of your school.
9. Offer childcare and refreshments at school events.
10. Obtain genuine input and assistance from parents to address areas of need.

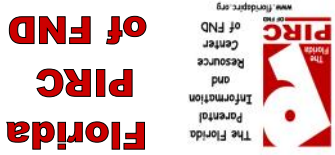

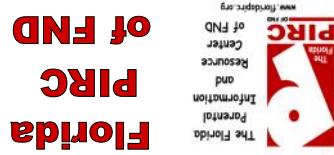
