- 2. Help parents feel connected by asking them to participate with the class.
- Invite parents to volunteer for class trips and classroom activities and events.
- 4. Involve parents in developing school policies and strategies.
- 5. Keep parents informed of what their kids are learning and how they can support this at home.
- Identify and address barriers to parent participation in school events and activities.
- 7. Sponsor fun family activities.
- 8. Collaborate with community organizations that serve the families of your school.
- Offer childcare and refreshments at school events.
- 10. Obtain genuine input and assistance from parents to address areas of need.
